

Sports Premium Funding

Throughout the academic year 2016-2017 Heron Way Primary School received £9555 from, PE and Sport Premium, to improve PE and Sport Provision.

The majority of the Sports Premium Funding has been used to employ a specialist sports coach where we have seen a significant rise in the children's health and wellbeing as well as a vast improvement in their attitudes towards physical education.

Below illustrates the range of ways we have spent the money:

- Employing specialist qualified sports coach.
- Being an active member of Horsham and District Primary Schools Activities Association (HDPSAA).
- Introducing 'Funky Fingers' into EYFS following the results from our bespoke assessment tool.
- Introducing Premier League Primary Stars to support the teaching and assessment of PE.
- Significantly raising the profile of PE within our locality.
- A significant increase in the range of after school sporting activities.
- Specialist coach running holiday sports clubs.

The results were as follows:</p> <p>So that the children had more of a voice in school, we did an assembly on sports and after-school clubs. Children were given the opportunity to give their thoughts and opinions on what they wanted in the way of clubs. In September 2017 we will now be starting a gymnastics club and a girls football which happens both before and after school. We also had a meeting with the school council who suggested to us that having stickers at sports day would give the children more of an enjoyment and achievement. They would be able to see what place they came and also easily show others and be proud. This worked well this sports day and children loved receiving stickers and showing them to parents and teachers. We decided to purchase a sports day trophy so that children, in their colour teams, could work together to try and gain enough points to win the trophy for the year. This worked really well and you could tell that there was a team spirit throughout the school on sports day.</p> <p>We have cycling specialists in teaching the Year 6 children valuable skills as to how to cycle safely on the roads. Weekly table tennis (Autumn and Spring term) and athletics training (Summer term) during curriculum time for the year 5 and 6 children enabled children to develop at their own level.</p> <p>By providing the children with a range of opportunities within school, we hope that this encourages them to lead physically active lifestyles and join clubs outside of school. 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<p>To encourage children to join sports clubs out of school to expand their social and physical wellbeing within the locality.</p>	<p>Competitions entered allowed children the opportunity to network with outside clubs and organisations finding out what is on offer locally for them to join.</p> <p>As mentioned above, Table Tennis and Athletics is provided by Horsham District Council within curriculum time and after school hours enabling children the opportunity to compete and interact with outside clubs.</p>	<p>September 16' - Ongoing</p>	<p>Many of our children attend clubs within the locality and represent our school as being active members of the sporting community.</p> <p>We also work closely with Heron Way Football club that takes place on the school grounds on Saturdays and Tuesday evenings. We shared the cost of buying football goals in which all children benefit from.</p> <p>Throughout the academic year, we have had a 20% increase in clubs that are available to the children.
